2. Apologies

3. Matters Arising

A61: A site meeting to be arranged to discuss resiting of the Hawthorne Street camera.

Renishaw: The meeting was updated with details of the fire bombing of the Renishaw housing. It had been agreed to purchase a replacement camera from the Safety Camera budget, however, the housing was not justified on casualty reduction grounds and the police suggested that it should not be replaced. An illuminated warning sign was suggested as a workable alternative.

Maintenance: Scott Wilson are to consider the need for a maintenance contract and the police suggested that it would be helpful if all of the Authorities had similar contracts that would provide a single contact number. Derby City and Scott Wilson to consider the above and report back to the next meeting.

New Sites for 2001/02: Derby City had agreed to install the five new sites funded in this years operational case. Following discussions it was agreed that Osmaston Road was the most appropriate route.

4. New Sites

Information was presented to the meeting on speed and casualties for all locations that had been suggested. The information contained details of the number of PICs, KSIs, and speed related collisions per km. This allowed a simple comparison to be made of sites and their suitability to be included on casualty reduction grounds. The meeting went through the lists discussing each site individually and considering its suitability for inclusion in the Safety Camera Project. Attached is the list of suggested sites for 2002/03.

The police asked members to consider for the next meeting if the information provided was sufficient or if additional information was required.

5. Any Other Business:

David Skinner raised the issue of bus lane enforcement and was advised that this wasn't currently being considered by the City Council and that unless it was casualty related it could not form part of the Safety Cameras Project.

Martin Gibson advised the meeting of work that would be taking place in November at Mastin Moor affecting two camera sites. The secondary markings would be reinstated as part of the works.
